These student leaders have inspired our coalition to invest in a new evidence-based social-emotional learning program next year. The Youth Ambassador project will pilot this new program which builds assets through leadership development, civic engagement, and the completion of 20 service-learning hours.

While 2021 may be just as unpredictable as this year, our coalition remains dedicated to our collective mission and will continue to prioritize positive youth development in Bartholomew County. We look forward to another year of expanding initiatives focused on youth empowerment, family engagement, and professional development to ensure every young person in our community has the opportunity to discover their passion in life and thrive.

WHAT WE DO






BARTHOLOMEW EMERGENCY CHILD CARE TASK FORCE

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, *Bartholomew County Emergency Child Care Task Force* has been formed to meet the growing needs of local residents seeking emergency child care options and to provide resources for parents and professionals during these challenging times.

CYD joined the *Bartholomew County Emergency Child Care Task Force* providing resources including the use of the coalition's website, customer relationship management system, and backbone staff time to increase awareness and educate child care providers and local families navigating the public health crisis.

YOUTH EMPOWERMENT SUMMIT

The Youth Empowerment Summit 2020 was certainly different from past years; however, we were so impressed with the great stories from schools and organizations about how many were able to help young people begin exploring their spark during the week of the Summit.

Why Ignite Your Spark?

According to research from Search Institute, a spark is what people are really passionate about doing, an activity that unleashes their energy and joy, one that may allow them to express themselves and make their own unique contributions to the world.

Research from Search Institute shows that when young people know their spark and have adult support in nurturing them, they are more likely to have a sense of purpose, to be socially competent, physically healthy, and to do better in school.

It was a collective effort to provide opportunities for diverse youth leaders to get inspired and expand their vision of a welcoming, safe, and supportive community for all.

SEARCH INSTITUTE - GETTING RELATIONSHIPS RIGHT

In March 2020, the Search Institute's two-day *Getting Relationships Right* regional training was completed successfully with incredible participation of professionals from local partners, out-of-state school districts and international agencies. Out of total participants, twenty-five local youth care professionals from Bartholomew County were trained to create schools and programs where all young people experience developmental relationships to help them be and become their best selves. Efforts are underway to add this framework to our current Developmental Assets initiatives in hopes of strengthening relationships between young people and those who care about them.

Our coalition has developed the *Building Assets in Every Youth* workshop series to introduce ideas on how we can contribute to the health and well-being of all our children and youth in Bartholomew County. These workshops provide not only the principles of the Developmental Assets® and Developmental Relationship frameworks but also share practical examples through the lens of our very own educators, out of school time leaders, and local youth advocates who live and work in our community.

DIVERSITY, EQUITY, & INCLUSION

We want to become the most equitable community for youth in the nation.

This year brought accelerated efforts and new opportunities for CYD to deepen our work in the area of diversity, equity, and inclusion. Investment in our initiatives increased leadership development programming for underserved teens, improved accessibility to resources and support for marginalized families, and engaged more youth professionals and community leaders in learning opportunities exploring implicit bias, racial justice, and building a sense of belonging in our community.

In addition to our coalition's direct efforts, CYD is actively engaged and supports the important work led by the Heritage Fund – Community Foundation of Bartholomew County, United Way of Bartholomew County, and the CivicLab with Community Education Coalition which has created a broader equity network to drive transformative change.

This complex and challenging work will require many voices if we truly believe Bartholomew County youth should feel a sense of belonging in their homes, schools, and community. We know now is the time to ask, listen, and work together so that every child, teen, and young adult confidently responds, "Yes, I belong."


YOUTH DEVELOPMENT INDEX 2019
