In 2022, we reviewed our original Youth Master Plan published in 2017 and completed strategic planning, which produced the Vision 2025 Youth Master Plan. The plan includes a Theory of Change (page 6) and a Strategic Map (page 7). It builds on the progress we have made implementing Search Institute's Developmental Assets® and Developmental Relationships® frameworks and providing resources for Bartholomew County youth, families, and professionals to improve social-emotional health and wellness.

Vision 2025 Youth Master Plan was produced with the help of our growing coalition partners, diverse stakeholders, and dedicated staff who continue to work together to ensure a promising future for our young people. While Vision 2025 Youth Master Plan is the capstone of 2022, there were many other exciting milestones. New initiatives were implemented, established programs were expanded, and our team grew to include a second full-time position and an additional part-time position. As you continue through this report, it is our hope to share with you the progress we made and the enthusiasm our team has for the CYD mission.

The median household income in one neighborhood may be as much as \$66,000 higher than another.




A child born in one neighborhood will live 17.3 years longer, on average, than a child born in a different part of the community.

YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

In 2022, At least **68,000** young people were reached through CYD Youth Empowerment Campaigns!



2022 has been such a fun year in Youth Empowerment! When I came to CYD in March, I immediately jumped in with planning our first all-day Youth Empowerment Summit, selecting new Youth Ambassadors, and training for the Wyman Teen Outreach Program (TOP). I am still in awe of the amazing things we've accomplished in this year of growth and change.

CYD Youth Empowerment Coordinator Our Youth Ambassador program is at its highest performance rate, with over 450 community service learning hours 70% attendance rate, and we haven't even started with 2023. Youth Ambassadors are doing well with their TOP lessons, and the ideas they have for our community are inspiring - just wait until you see what they have up their sleeves for Global Youth Service Day!

Youth Empowerment is also taking the mental health of our community's youth seriously in 2023. We are partnering with Su Casa to bring Teen Mental Health First Aid to the helpers in grades 10-12. Through this program which will be offered in both Spanish and English, we have the opportunity to enable and empower our students to recognize signs of mental health challenges and help their friends out of crisis situations. Youth Ambassadors are Bartholomew County high school students in grades 10-12 committed to meaningful civic engagement and personal growth.


































YOUTH AMBASSADORS

CYD's Youth Ambassador Program aims to empower youth to thrive in adulthood by developing their unique talents, cultivating healthy behaviors and relationships, and actively participating in community projects to make a difference.



The 2022-2023 Youth Ambassadors identify themselves as "teens making a positive impact in our community." At the midpoint in the program, the Youth Ambassadors have created an entire anti-vaping campaign that included designing and printing posters, producing a video, and encouraging positive coping mechanisms for stress. This spring, in recognition of Global Youth Service Day, they will partner with Columbus Parks & Rec and United Way of Bartholomew County to organize a Youth United Parks Beautification Day in Bartholomew County.

YOUTH EMPOWERMENT SUMMIT

A full day of engaging activities designed to build leadership skills, inspire personal action, and expand a vision of a welcoming, safe, and supportive community for all.

Youth Empowerment Summit 2022 was attended by **89 students** representing home schools and each Bartholomew County High School. Students heard from Columbus Mayor Jim Leinhoop and Keynote Speaker Tyshaun Allen. They participated in three workshops, "Adulting 101," "Building a Sense of Belonging," and "You Matter, Now Organize Your Life."

Attending students also heard from a panel of four recent graduates who reflected on their experiences for a perspective on life after high school. That panel was moderated by Zacaria Scruggs, who at the time was a Senior at Columbus North and served as a 2021-2022 CYD Youth Ambassador.




SHINE ON **POSTCARD CAMPAIGN**

First launched in 2017, the Shine On Postcard Campaign celebrates United Nations International Youth Day. Each year, student artists submit designs interpreting the theme "Shine On," and four are selected for print. The postcards are then distributed across the community for anyone to send positive messages to young people in Bartholomew County. To date, over 37,000 free Shine On postcards have been distributed thanks to our coalition partners and the public.









YOUTH EMPOWERMENT



TEEN MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

Teen Mental Health First Aid (tMHFA) teaches teens in grades 10-12, or ages 15-18, how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental health and substance use challenges among their friends and peers. Teens will learn the skills they need to have supportive conversations with their friends and how to get help from a responsible and trusted adult.

CYD is presenting tMHFA in partnership with Su Casa. Thanks to this partnership, the program will be offered in English and Spanish. tMHFA is made possible by a grant from the Family and Social Services Administration Division of Mental Health and Addiction.

IYKYK (IF YOU KNOW, YOU KNOW)



Youth in our community have told us that they are in need of things to do in their free time, so we've created IYKYK, or If You Know, You Know. Tailored specifically for 6-12th graders, this monthly newsletter highlights activities in our community, such as free events, volunteer opportunities, and affordable fun.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Increasing access to quality learning opportunities.



2022 was a season of change for our coalition, and the same held true in our Professional Development sector. Kate Slabosky transitioned to the role of Professional Development Specialist, and I came on board as Professional Development Coordinator in mid-October. While I haven't been here very long, I have seen first-hand the difference the coalition is making in our community, and I'm excited about where we've been and where we're going.

We continue to remain dedicated to Building Assets in Every Youth and launched the Community Certificate Program in 2022. We ended the year with six local organizations on board, and more than 70 employees trained in Search Institute's Developmental Assets and/or Developmental Relationship frameworks. We're looking forward to expanding this program and adding even more organizations in 2023. We also were thrilled to host our first in-person workshop of the year in November, where seventeen community members learned how they could support the youth of our community through Developmental Relationships.

We head into 2023 with great anticipation, as we'll be adding community workshops on Understanding Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), spearheaded by Kate, and Youth Mental Health First Aid, led by myself and made possible by a grant from the Family and Social Services Administration Division of Mental Health and Addiction and our partnership with Su Casa.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Family support looks different in the Pre-K years than it does for parents of Middle School students. It looks different for those whose first language is not English; different for those facing poverty or mental illness. YOUTH & FAMILY RESOURCE SEARCH

Coalition Partners share CYD resources and engagement opportunities with their staff and stakeholders. Representative(s) from the Coalition Partner organization attend CYD Open Meetings and are active in specific CYD initiatives that align with their organization's mission.

NETWORK PARTNERS - Supporting the Work

CYD Network Partners are organizations and individuals supporting CYD's Youth Master Plan. Network Partners may be located in Bartholomew County or live, work, or serve stakeholders outside our community. Network Partners receive CYD's monthly newsletter, which includes timely information on upcoming meetings, opportunities, and resources to advance a culture of positive youth development. FUNDING

CYD has a long history of collaborative support in Bartholomew County, which enables the coalitions to provide youth empowerment, family engagement, and professional development programming opportunities at no cost to participating youth and adults. In order to minimize competition for funding with local community partners, the coalition does not solicit charitable donations from individuals and has not hosted fundraising campaigns as part of our sustainability planning. Instead, CYD continues to find innovative ways to maximize resources and build long-term connections with partners at the local and state level.

With multi-year financial investment launched in 2017 by the Heritage Fund - The Community Foundation of Bartholomew County, CYD has successfully expanded partnerships and secured over \$425,000 in additional funding for administrative investment and programming initiatives through grants, associated organizations, and sponsorships. Of note is multi-year support from the Mark & Wendy Elwood Foundation, the Indiana Department of Health Title V Block Grant, and partnership with Foundation for Youth - Prevention Initiatives' FSSA - Division of Mental Health and Addiction, Bureau of Substance Abuse Prevention and Mental Health Promotion Grant. In 2022 CYD was awarded first-time grant funding from the Columbus Regional Health Foundation (allocated in 2023) and was selected for the Indiana FSSA - Division of Mental Health and Addiction, Stop the Stigma Mental Health Grant in partnership with Su Casa.
